Four outstanding artists make their FCM debut this coming season: pianist Awadagin Pratt, an Avery Fisher Career Grant recipient; pianist Tony Siqi Yun, a prodigious talent on the keyboard; violinist Benjamin Beilman, one of the youngest artists to be appointed to the faculty of the Curtis Institute of Music who will be joined on our stage by renowned pianist Steven Osborne; and celebrated Italian ensemble Quartetto di Cremona, teaming up with local favorite and Principal Violist of the Colorado Symphony Orchestra, Basil Vendryes. The season concludes with FCM favorite Miró Quartet joining forces with saxophonist and composer Steven Banks, a recent Avery Fisher Career Grant recipient.

These ten concerts are grouped, as in years past, in two series—this year with a new twist. In addition to a

seven-concert chamber series, FCM is excited to introduce a long-requested series of three Sunday afternoon concerts.

Presented at 4 PM, this Sunday Series includes the season opener with the Takács Quartet, the Dover Quartet, and Tony Siqi Yun's piano recital.

# **AWADAGIN PRATT, PIANO**

Making his FCM debut, Awadagin Pratt gained international recognition after winning the renowned Naumburg International Piano Competition in 1992 and being awarded the Avery Fisher Career Grant. He is hailed as "one of the great and distinctive American pianists and conductors of our time" (WGBH). Pratt's wide-ranging program includes Fred Hersch's Nocturne for Left Hand Alone and Peteris Vasks's Castillo Interior, as well as works from Couperin. Rachmaninoff, and Chopin.

# TONY SIQI YUN, PIANO

Canadian pianist Tony Siqi Yun, a much sought-after soloist and recitalist, was the Gold Medalist at the 2019 First China International Music Competition. He was awarded the Rheingau Music Festival's 2023 Lotto-Förderpreis. Yun's FCM debut performance includes Beethoven's "Appassionata" Sonata as well as works by Brahms, Busoni, and Schumann.

# BENJAMIN BEILMAN, VIOLIN STEVEN OSBORNE, PIANO

Scottish pianist Steven Osborne, winner of two Gramophone Awards, makes a long-awaited return to FCM's series. Osborne will be performing with violinist Benjamin Beilman, one of the youngest artists to be appointed to the faculty of the Curtis Institute of Music. Works by Clara Schumann and Lili Boulanger will be performed alongside sonatas by Brahms and Frank.

# MIRÓ QUARTET STEVEN BANKS, SAXOPHONE

Formed in 1995, the Miró Quartet was awarded first prize at the Banff International String Quartet Competition and the Naumburg Chamber Music Competition. In 2005, the Quartet became the first ensemble ever to be awarded the coveted Avery Fisher Career Grant. Saxophonist Steven Banks, also awarded an Avery Fisher Career Grant in 2022, is a performer and composer. In addition to Haydn's Quartet in D Major, Banks's arrangements of works by Shaw and Golijov will be included on this program, along with the premiere of his new string guartet with saxophone, commissioned by Friends of Chamber Music.
